



Interactive Walking & Bike Trails

will be placed throughout Rijnenburg. Several themed routes will focus on different periods of Rijnenburg's history and highlight key locations.

Do keep in mind that this does not have to be an exhaustive list of routes, they are just a couple of ideas that can be added to!

A **Roman history themed route** follows the course of the Roman river and thus leads through the "Stroomrugpark".

A long **Medieval history themed route** starts at Ridderhofstad Rijnenburg, then follows the Ringkade to the 11th century strips of farmland in the north of Rijnenburg, goes along the Meerndijk, and then follows the Nedereindseweg back to Ridderhofstad Rijnenburg.

An **early modern route** would lead participants past the Eendenkooi, Lange Vliet, and Stenen Kamer.

Locations

(inter)activities

To make the trails **more interactive** than *just* walking routes with signs, a **variety** of activities and sights are incorporated.

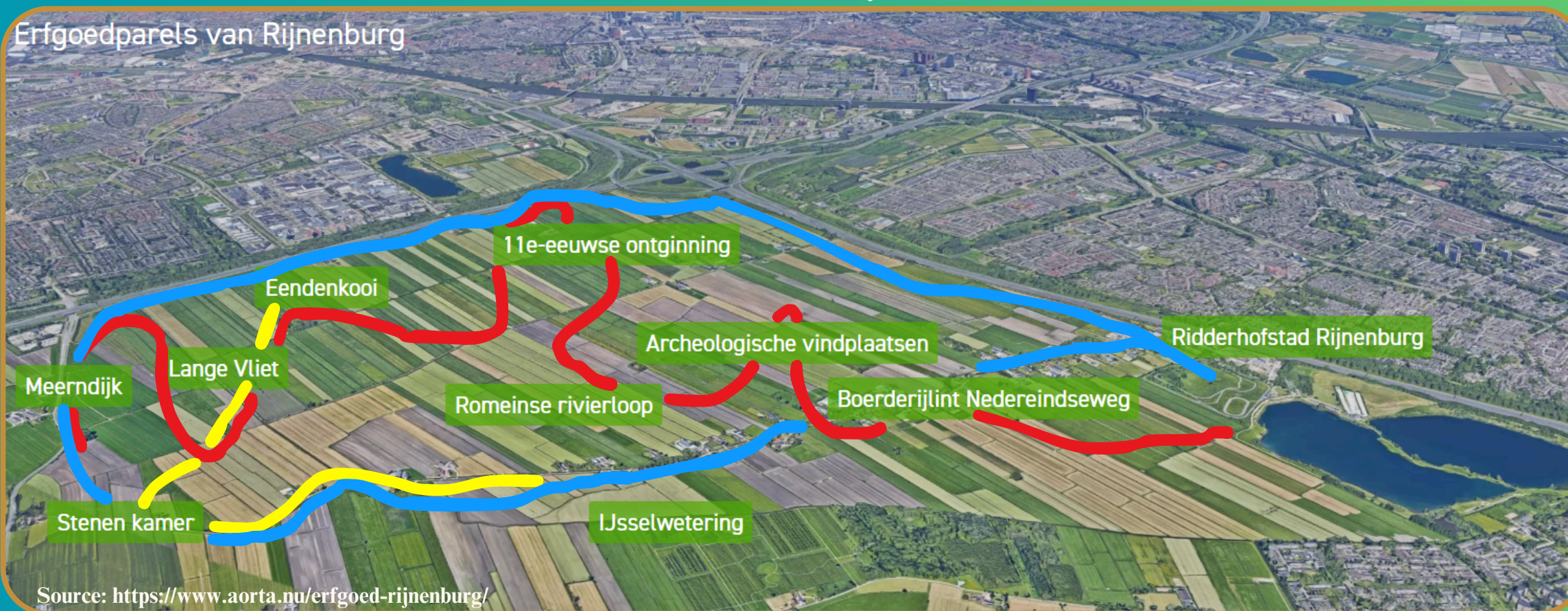
Signs along the way provide information about key locations and the daily lives of the people who used to live there!

Some signs will include fun activities (for all ages) to inspire people to take the history of Rijnenburg home, such as historical **recipes**, **(board) games**, and **art & crafts ideas** that fit the route's theme.

History association *Het Verhaal van Rijnenburg* will organize (yearly?) **guided tours** along the trail. Creating opportunity for group activity encourages the forming/strengthening of community :)

Archeological finds could be **displayed** along the trails, for example underground visible through glass plates you could walk over; or in a multifunctional picnic table-like construction, similar to those found in the Arena mall in Den Bosch.

Artworks inspired by Rijnenburg's history could also be placed along the trails and thus incorporated into the atmosphere of the neighborhood.



Room for **Geocaches** along the trails: I would advise whoever will be in charge of maintenance to permit Geocachers to place caches and to invite them to collaborate with Het Verhaal van Rijnenburg; Geocachers are often very much interested in local history and their contribution could really enrich the trails!

The logo of the **cicada fibula** will be visible on all signs and signposts.

Practicalities

Color-coded **signposts** indicate the routes



To increase **accessibility**: the trails are themed but do not have a rigid overarching plot; they are **episodic/modular**. Participants can follow them by bike or by foot, however they want. They do not *have* to follow all of the route or walk/cycle it all in order

Signs along the way are in Dutch and English. If needed, more translations could be added via a QR code. Perhaps, the translations could be requested/provided by Rijnenburgers.
